The Australian Air Force Cadets (AAFC) is a child development organisation administered by the Royal Australian Air Force (RAAF), developing adolescents from the age of 12 to the age of 18 in a **military** and aviation environment.

Joining Requirements – Must be at least 12 years of age and turning 13 or older in the year of acceptance, be enrolled in higher school education (minimum year 7) in the year of acceptance and not have attained the age of 16 years.

429 SQN is posted at Fort Queenscliff and is part of 4 Wing Victoria consisting of 4 Specialist Flights and 27 Squadrons.

429 SQN parades every Monday night from 1800 to 2145 during the school terms and not on school or public holidays.

Cadets on acceptance agree to a 75% attendance rate and are expect to maintain a <u>75% or</u> <u>better</u> attendance, there are also expected attendance for some activities during the year such as ANZAC Day, recruit training weekend and some squadron extracurricular training i.e. Bivouacs, on acceptance cadets to abide by all cadets force regulations, standing instructions and cadet behavioral policy.
